Stationery and ICT Resource Scheme 2009

Participation in this scheme is voluntary but the school strongly encourages all families to participate as it ensures that the students always have the correct stationery items required for daily classroom use as well as saving parents/carers time and money in sourcing suitable quality items. It is of great assistance for classroom organisation when all students have the same items.

The P&C supports this scheme, which the school manages within the policy and guidelines of the Department of Education and the Arts. The school does not make any profit from this scheme with all monies being expended on the contributing students in the year it is collected. However, as we do not pay GST we are able to purchase quality resources, in bulk and so ensure value for money.

Please note:

The Resource Scheme does not include costs for excursions, camps, arts council performances, or the instrumental music fee and hire (if participating)

The scheme does not cover stationery for years 5 - 7

Below is the cost and an example of resources provided in the scheme:

Prep Year: \$85

- Stationery items – pencils, erasers, sharpeners, rulers, markers, colouring pencils, crayons, glue, scissors, manilla folders, whiteboard markers etc,
- Consumables for student use – art materials, science, craft, cooking ingredients, learning materials.
- Reproduced class materials and class notes
- Teacher prepared workbooks/worksheets
- Technology software, CD's and printing costs

Years 1– 4: \$95

- Stationery items – pencils, pens, markers, crayons, colouring pencils, glue, scissors, erasers, sharpeners, rulers, manilla folders, whiteboard markers
- Consumables for student use – art, science, craft, cooking, learning
- Use of resources – calculator etc
- Use of reference books/materials – dictionary, atlas, home readers
- Reproduced class materials
- Teacher prepared worksheets/booklets
- Technology software, CD's and printing costs

Years 5 – 7: \$50

- Consumables for student use – art, cooking, science
- Use of resources – calculators, protractors, set squares, etc.
- Use of reference books/materials – class readers, dictionary, atlas
- Reproduced class materials
- Teacher prepared booklets/worksheets
- Technology software, CD's and printing costs

Terms and Conditions:

- All previous year's fees must be paid in full
- Failure to pay the full fee after joining may result in exclusion from certain activities, unless materials are provided by parents
- Books issued to students are to be kept in good condition. Students may be responsible for replacement costs of items that are negligently damaged or lost before any further issues can be made. The school is to be notified of the loss or damage to an item.
- Resources provided under the scheme remain the property of the scheme and must be returned when the student leaves the school or at the end of the year.
- Books and resources provided under the scheme will not be issued to students whose parents/carers choose not to participate at all
- All Resource Scheme monies received by the school on behalf of the P&C Association will be banked into the school general account, which is subject to annual audit.
- When students enrol part way through the year, the fee is reduced on a pro-rata basis.
- Likewise a pro-rata refund will be issued to students who leave part way through a year. This will be based on the cost of consumed materials and the cost of replacing lost or damaged resources.

Financial Difficulty

Parents/Carers experiencing financial difficulty are most welcome to pay the scheme over time. Please contact the Office staff who will discuss the matter sensitively with you and develop an agreed plan for payment.

Should you choose not to join the Scheme

You are required to inform the school if you choose not to participate so alternative arrangements can be negotiated.

You will be responsible for providing all text books and resources for your child and will need to make arrangements with the school for ICT software, student printing, teacher prepared worksheets and booklets, home and class readers, consumables, art and science materials.

These costs can be collected from the Office.
